Alabama	April 29, 2020	Updates the March 25, 2020 bulletin. Pre-licensing certificates which expire in March, April or May are extended 90 days past the expiration date. 	March 25, 2020	Pre-licensing completion certificates which expire in March or April are extended 60 days past expiration date. Classroom CE classes may be provided via webinar. Arkansas	May 11, 2020	Temporarily halting converting a license from active to inactive due to failure to renew or pay licensing fees. The final date for renewal has been extended 45 days. 	March 27, 2020	Producer licensing renewal expirations are extended 60 days beginning on March 11, 2020. Continuing education required to be completed by a producer's expiration date are not due until May 15, 2020. Colorado	May 11, 2020	Allows for temporary resident producer licenses until July 31, 2020. Must have a sponsoring insurer or producer. Temporary license is valid for 180 days and may be converted. https://drive.google.com/file/d/1ckwM_QEmWSIYfEdTn_BijlrUGNRqoA_M/view
	May 1, 2020	Starting May 1, 2020, testing centers are reopening in Colorado. https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/dora/covid-19-and-insurance
	April 2, 2020	Waives proctor requirements for continuing education exams and allows for the continuation of license and renewal deadlines during the COVID-19 outbreak in Colorado. Connecticut	April 21, 2020	Allows for temporary resident producer licenses. Must be appointed by an insurer. License will expire 180 days from date of issue. License is convertible. 	March 23, 2020	Renewal date for licenses that expire from March 24, 2020 to May 31, 2020 are extended to June 30, 2020. CE compliance requirements that must be completed between March 24, 2020 to May 31, 2020 are extended to June 30, 2020. Delaware	April 3, 2020	Allows for temporary licenses for those unable to take an examination. Temporary licensees have 90 days after testing centers reopen to take the exam. Florida	April 17, 2020	Allows for temporary resident producer licenses for health, life and personal lines. Must meet fingerprinting, criminal history and background checks. Must be appointed by a sponsoring insurer. License shall expire six months after the date it was issued. Hawaii	March 19, 2020	Workers compensation adjuster licenses subject to renewal on April 16, will be extended without examinations until 45 days after the examinations are made available. 	March 18, 2020	New producer and surplus lines licenses should continue to go through NIPR. Renewal licenses should continue to process online through the department. Illinois	April 21, 2020	Suspends requirements for classroom education allowing for webinars or distance learning; suspends the 90 day limitation on temporary licenses during the state of emergency; and suspends the requirement that the two part producer licensing test must be passed within 90 days of each other.
Indiana	May 11, 2020	Update - License renewal applications and continuing education due on March 31, April 30, or May 31, 2020 have been extended to June 4, 2020. As of May 1, 2020, testing vendor sites have been reopened. https://www.in.gov/idoi/2611.htm

Iowa	April 9, 2020	Allows for temporary licenses for producers who have completed training but are unable to take a licensing exam. Licenses may be obtained until June 1 and are good for three months following issuance. Appointments are not required. Kansas	Updated April 29, 2020	<p>The Pearson Vue Professional Centers in Kansas are open to those needing to take the Kansas Insurance Producer Exams. In addition, the Kansas Insurance Department authorized Pearson Vue to open up its entire third-party vendor network in Kansas and nationwide to offer the Kansas Insurance Producer Exams. The Pearson Vue Professional Centers in Colorado, Iowa, Nebraska, Missouri and Oklahoma will also be providing the Kansas Insurance Producer Exams. Kentucky	April 30, 2020	<p>Allows for temporary resident producer licenses. Must be appointed by a sponsoring insurer and complete background check information. Temporary licenses will be issued for a period of 180 days. Licenses will expire 60 days after the state of emergency ends. Beginning with those who had CE due March 31, 2020 and continuing through the end of the state of emergency, licensees have 60 days from the end of the emergency to complete CE. Maine	April 15, 2020	<p>Allows for a temporary license for a resident producer. Applications must be faxed, mailed or emailed to the Bureau. Temporary producer must have a licensed sponsor and must be appointed by an insurer. Maine	March 25, 2020	Classroom continuing education courses may be provided via webinar. Remote proctoring is allowed for exams. Mississippi	April 7, 2020	Allows initial applicants who have met all pre-licensing requirements but have been unable to take an exam to receive a temporary license. Licenses may be converted. Utah	April 21, 2020	<p>Allows for temporary resident producer licenses. Must have a sponsoring insurer or agency. Must certify compliance with temporary license requirements.
